and you shower us again with the water of life.


We praise you for your salvation through water, for the water in this font, and for all water everywhere.



**ACCLAMATION FOR GOD'S WORD** Lord, Let My Heart be Good Soil Handt Hanson (b. 1950) We often offer an Alleluia to signify the transition to a Jesus-focused excerpt of the bible. Instead, in this summer time, we are invited to share the whole of God's Word, remembering the presence of the Trinity from the beginning, and the urging God expects in our sharing of how that Word challenges, admonishes, loves, and invites us into something larger than who we are.





Early Christians prayed various forms of a prayer of thanks and were invited to give praise for God's gifts and Christ's command to "do this in remembrance of me." The prayer includes the words spoken by Jesus at the Last Supper. The language of this prayer, and its variety, changes for seasons and circumstances. This song, called Holy "Sanctus" in Latin, is an ancient part of Christian liturgy, based on Isaiah, chapter 2.

#### THANKSGIVING AT THE TABLE

In the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying: This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin. Do this for the remembrance of me. We give you thanks, most gracious God, for Christ, the bread of heaven , and for giving us a foretaste of your hope for us.

### Enliven us to be your body in the world and to serve those who are in need.

Empower the gift of your Spirit: in our gathering; within this meal; among your people; throughout the world. **Amen.**




All people, including children, are invited to the Lord's Supper. We encourage you to participate in a way that is meaningful for you.



### WELCOME CHILDREN

One way we welcome children at FELC is with a Spirit Space in the Chapel of the Saints. Each week they will receive a coloring page relating to the scripture stories for the day. Adults have chairs to sit in while worshiping with children. We welcome children by encouraging them and celebrating the joy and livelihood that children offer.

#### LITURGY CHANGES FOR THE SUMMER

Liturgy refers to the patterns, forms, elements, words, silence, and actions of people through which public worship happens. The changed order of worship affords us a structure meant to uplift us all, wherein each progression of a liturgy draws us both in and up, as a community seeking the God that is already present, inviting the Spirit to engage us, and offering us a newer way to engage God through a language that expresses our joy, lamentation, desire, and hope. We will use different elements (at times a Thanksgiving for Baptism, Confession of Sin, or a Creed) and a times we will celebrate in other forms.
